

Who Can Make a Determination of Unaccompanied Homeless Youth Status?

The following chart lists the four groups of professionals authorized to make a determination that a student meets the definition of an unaccompanied homeless youth or is self-supporting and at risk of becoming homeless for filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The right-hand column provides additional information.

Professional	Comments
School district or high school McKinney-Vento liaison	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Determines if student is eligible to receive services under the McKinney-Vento Act • Must make determination on or after date on the FAFSA • Can only make a determination for a student's first year college • May provide supporting documentation for subsequent year determinations
Director or designee of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Program must be funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) • Can only make a determination if the student utilized the services of the shelter or program on or after the date specified on the FAFSA • The length of time a student utilized shelter or program services doesn't matter • May provide supporting documentation for subsequent year determinations
Director or designee of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can only make a determination if the student utilized the services of the shelter or program on or after the date specified on the FAFSA • The length of time a student utilized center or program services doesn't matter • May provide supporting documentation for subsequent year determinations
Financial aid administrators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must make a determination if a student does not have a determination from another professional • Purpose of determination is to confirm student's living situation meets the McKinney-Vento Act definition of homelessness • Making a determination does not require a dependency appeal • Making a determination is not an exercise of professional judgment authority • Determination may be made using a documented interview • Other professionals such as school district liaisons may provide supporting documentation
