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


Colusa County

- County in California
- Population: 21,547
- Median Household Income: \$59, 401
- County Poverty Percentage: 12%
- Local Data for 2020/2021
 - Student Population in Colusa County: 4,646
 - Total Homeless Student Population: 440
 - This means 9.58% of our student population is considered homeless



Williams, California

- Population: 5,408
- Median Household Income: \$65,580
- Socioeconomically Disadvantaged: 92.4%





Williams Unified School District

- 2020-2021 School Enrollment Data
 - English Learners: 706
 - Foster Youth: 0
 - McKinney Vento Youth: 150
 - Migrant Education: 138
 - Students with disabilities: 148
 - Socioeconomically Disadvantaged: 1,195
 - Total Students: 1,338




Williams Unified School District

- Most migrant students qualify for McKinney Vento if they live in the migrant camp
 - Williams Migrant Camp is considered substandard housing
- When McKinney Vento students register, we ensure:
 - They are enrolled immediately
 - They are provided school lunch free of charge
 - They are provided Physical Education uniform free of charge
 - They are provided school supplies free of charge



Williams Unified School District

- Ensuring Migrant students graduate:
 - Meet with parents and students
 - Credit review
 - Graduation plan
 - May qualify for reduced credits under California Assembly Bill 1806
 - Partial Credits





Migrant Resource Fair

Yearly Event that started a collaboration with Colusa County Office of Education (CCOE) and Williams USD with only two partners

• Started in 2015

Initial goal of the Migrant Resource Fair

 Help expedite the enrollment process, ensure all students were identified McKinney Vento, referred to the Migrant Education recruiter, and to promote school programs

Over the years it has evolved and become a huge event!










Focus on Expediting Enrollment for Migrant Students
